### VI. **NEW BUSINESS**

#### 1. **Gate City Police Department: Vehicle Procurement**

Town Manager Greg Jones stated that as a result of the 2020 Ford Explorer being involved in a crash, we need to replace the vehicle for the Police Department. Town Manager Greg Jones stated that Freedom Ford has two 2018 Dodge Durangos with 19,942 and 34,536 miles with a cost of \$28,760 each. Town Manager Greg Jones stated that these vehicles are from the Town of Appalachia and they have dissolved their police department and are looking to liquidate their assets. Town Manager Greg Jones stated that the vehicles come outfitted and we will just need the in-car camera, radar, decal and a few miscellaneous items to get them completely outfitted. Town Manager Greg Jones stated that one of these vehicles will replace the 2020 Ford Explorer and the other will be a spare. Town Manager Greg Jones stated that we have learned that there is some grant opportunity for this purchase available on October 1<sup>st</sup>. Town Manager Greg Jones stated that Rural Development has approved the procurement. Town Manager Greg Jones stated that the total is \$75,200 and the grant portion will be \$24,000, which will leave us \$51,220 to finance for three years at 2.8% through Rural Development.

Vice-Mayor Robin Richards asked if we are going to purchase the used vehicles and not new? Town Manager Greg Jones stated yes, the new 2021 Ford Explorers will be just under \$38,000 and this will save approximately \$11,000 per vehicle. Council Member Roberts stated that the vehicles are already equipped, and we will only have to do a minimal amount to get them ready. Chief of Police Justin Miller stated that the mileage is low on the vehicles for 2018's and that Sergeant Penley inspected the vehicles and stated that everything looked good on them. Chief Miller stated that the Sheriff's Department is switching to Durangos, it will save a lot of money to purchase the vehicles that are already outfitted, and he has spoken to individuals who have test driven the vehicles who have no complaints. Chief Miller stated that the vehicle with 19,000 miles on it still has a 16,000-mile drive train warranty on it. Council Member Wallace W. Ross, Jr. asked are there any problems on the service records of these vehicles? Town Manager Greg Jones stated that there are none that he is aware of. Council Member Ross asked who will service these vehicles? Chief Miller stated that if there is something that is under warranty, we will take it to Freedom Ford, however, all other problems will be serviced locally. Council Member Ross asked if this information just came through within the last 48 hours? Town Manager Greg Jones stated that the information about the vehicles came as of late last week while the financing agreements and the grant came as of a couple of hours ago. Council Member Ross asked when the finance committee knew about the grant? Council Member Cassell stated that the finance committee received the e-mail right before the meeting. Council Member Cassell stated that this is the best route to go in order to get a spare to start rotating out instead of purchasing two or three vehicles at a time. Council Member Ross asked if the vehicles are both equally equipped? Chief Miller stated that both vehicles have a prisoner transport cage, a radio, lights and siren box, and plastic filament around the windows. Council Member Ross asked if we should be looking at a 2019 model? Chief Miller stated that there aren't any available locally that he is aware of. Council Member Cassell asked Chief Miller if he is sure the vehicles have the police package? Chief Miller stated yes. Council Member Ross asked if the vehicles are V6 or V8 with 4 wheel drive? Chief Miller stated that they are V6 with all wheel drive. Council Member Ross asked if the vehicles have been inspected? Chief Miller stated that the vehicles were inspected by Sergeant Penley.
