Gate City, VA is one of fourteen encampment stops on the three week journey (May 7-30th, 2016) for public presentations. The purpose of this journey is to preserve America's Frontier History that is fading into the past. The frontiersmen and women will also serve as educators, each teaching of the skills necessary to survive on the frontier.
